(Developing Sea Legs in a Chaotic World)

2 Timothy 1:3-7 Text:

"I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a clear conscience, as I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. <sup>4</sup>As I remember your tears, I long to see you, that I may be filled with joy. 5I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well. <sup>6</sup>For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, <sup>7</sup> for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control." 2 Timothy 1:3-7

"When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. ⁴In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I shall not be afraid. What can flesh do to me?" Psalm 56:3-4

"I will not be afraid of many thousands of people who have set themselves against me all around." Psalm 3:6

"The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? THOSE WHO TRUST IN CHRIST SHOULD WALK IN A SELF-CONTROLLED, CLEAR THINKING MANNER, BUT NOT GIVE WAY TO DISCONSOLATE FEAR. (1 Timothy 3:2, 11; Titus 2:2)

We have reasons for grave concern but should guard against a spirit of TREMBLING FEAR.



Those who trust in the kingly rule of Christ when true to their doctrine will live with a far more comprehensive trust in God in all circumstances and a far greater freedom from worry about the future, because they are convinced, not just that God will somehow cause his major purposes to work out right in the end, but that all things work together for good for those who love God and are called according to his purpose (Romans 8:28). They will also be thankful to God for all the benefits that come to us from whatever quarter, for the one who believes in providence is assured that the ultimate reason for all things that happen is not some chance occurrence in the universe, nor is it the "free will" of another human being, but it is ultimately the goodness of God himself. They will also have great patience in adversity, knowing that it has not come about because God (continued >>)

was unable to prevent it, but because it, too, is part of his wise

plan. So the differences are immense. Calvin says: 'Gratitude of mind for the favorable outcome of things, patience in adversity, and also incredible freedom from worry about the future all necessarily follow upon this knowledge. Ignorance of providence is the ultimate of all miseries; the highest blessedness lies in the knowledge of it." Wayne Grudem, Systematic Theology, p.347




